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CLIENT SECURITY BOARD APPROVES CLAIMS

ST. PAUL -- At its January 2016 meeting, the Minnesota Client Security Board approved payment of three claims, in the total amount of \$33,699.93, against disbarred attorney Paul Arthur Moe, suspended attorney Terry H. Rueb, and deceased attorney John Allen Hatling.

The Board approved one claim against Paul Arthur Moe in the amount of \$15,957.28. Moe last practiced law in Edina, Minnesota. He was disbarred by the Minnesota Supreme Court in August 2014.

The Board approved one claim against Terry H. Rueb in the amount of \$15,000. Rueb last practiced in Burnsville, Minnesota. He was suspended by the Minnesota Supreme Court in December 2014.

The Board approved one claim against deceased attorney John Allen Hatling in the amount of \$2,742.65. Hatling last practiced in Fergus Falls, Minnesota.

The Client Security Fund was established by the Minnesota Supreme Court, and is funded by Minnesota attorneys to reimburse clients who suffer loss of money or other property from the dishonest conduct of their attorney. The Fund does not cover losses resulting from negligence of lawyers. The Fund is administered by a Board appointed by the Court, and consists of five lawyer members and two non-lawyer members. All serve without compensation as a public service.
