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CLIENT SECURITY BOARD APPROVES CLAIMS

ST. PAUL -- At its January 2015 meeting, the Minnesota Client Security Board approved payment of four claims, in the total amount of \$13,848.79, against disabled attorney Jill E. Clark and deceased attorneys Steven K. Marden and Gregory K. Larson.

The Board approved one claim against Jill E. Clark in the total amount of \$1,000. Clark last practiced law in Golden Valley, Minnesota. Clark was placed on disability inactive status by the Minnesota Supreme Court in July 2013.

The Board approved two claims against deceased attorney Steven K. Marden in the amount of \$11,598.79. The Board also reconsidered and approved payment of additional funds on a prior claim against Marden, in the amount of \$320. The Board has now approved five claims against Marden in the total amount of \$16,893.31. Marden last practiced in St. Paul, Minnesota.

The Board approved one claim against deceased attorney Gregory K. Larson in the amount of \$1,250. Larson last practiced in Little Falls, Minnesota.

The Client Security Fund was established by the Minnesota Supreme Court, and is funded by Minnesota attorneys to reimburse clients who suffer loss of money or other property from the dishonest conduct of their attorney. The Fund does not cover losses resulting from the malpractice or negligence of lawyers. The Fund is administered by a Board appointed by the Court, and consists of five lawyer members and two non-lawyer members. All serve without compensation as a public service.
