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CLIENT SECURITY BOARD APPROVES CLAIMS

ST. PAUL – At its September 17, 2018, meeting, the Minnesota Client Security Board approved payment of four claims, in the total amount of \$3,250, against disbarred attorney George E. Hulstrand, Jr. and suspended attorney Anthony John Kerschbaum.

The Board approved one claim against disbarred attorney George E. Hulstrand, Jr. in the amount of \$1,250. The Board has now approved two claims against Hulstrand totaling \$2,600. Hulstrand last practiced law in Willmar, Minnesota. He was disbarred by the Minnesota Supreme Court in April 2018.

The Board approved three claims against suspended attorney Anthony John Kerschbaum in the amount \$2,000. Kerschbaum last practiced law in Afton, Minnesota. He was suspended by the Minnesota Supreme Court in September 2018.

The Client Security Fund was established by the Minnesota Supreme Court, and is funded by Minnesota attorneys to reimburse clients who suffer loss of money or other property due to the dishonest conduct of their attorney. The Fund does not cover losses resulting from negligence of lawyers. The Fund is administered by a Board appointed by the Court, and consists of five lawyer members and two non-lawyer members. All serve without compensation as a public service.
